3 Easy Steps to Voting Absentee:

Step 1: Fill out the attached Absentee Ballot Card. **Step 2:** Detach the card, drop it in the mail and wait for your Absentee Ballot to be sent to your home. **Step 3:** Vote by marking your ballot, then mail it to your municipal office or dropping it off before 8 p.m. on Election Day, November 2nd.
